

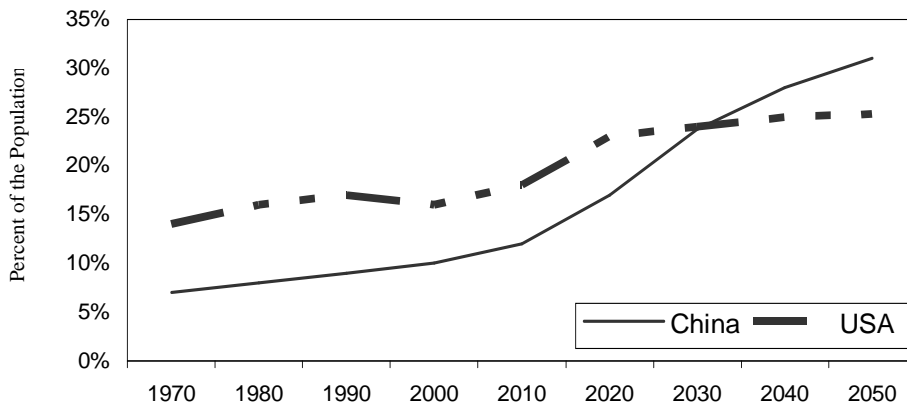

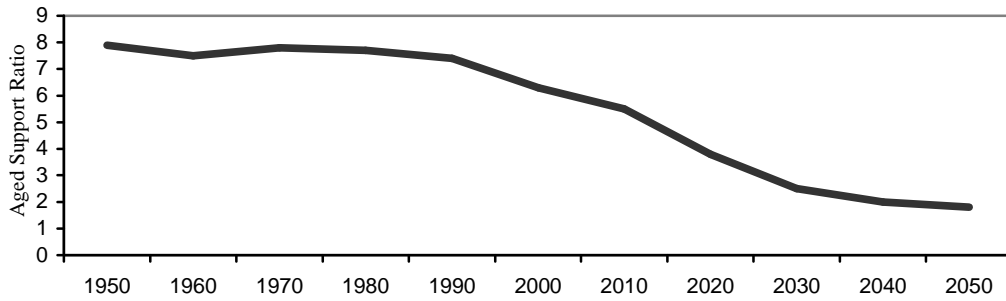
Change in China's Working-Age Population (Aged 15-59) by Decadeⁱ



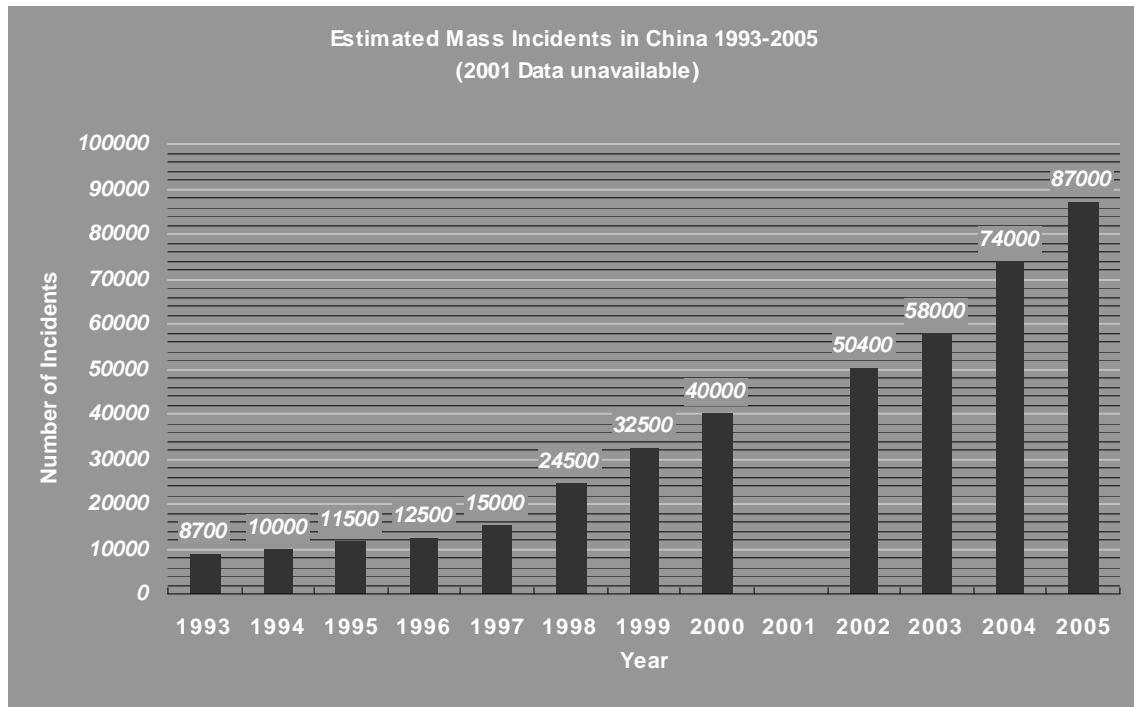
Percentage of the Elderly (Aged 60 & Over) in China and the United States by Decadeⁱⁱ
